May is Child & Family Month!

In the months of May and June, both the church and the society have traditionally focused attention on the child, the family, mothers, fathers, weddings and anniversaries. Child's Month, Mothers' Day, and Fathers' Day all receive great attention during this season.

During the month of May, in the Cayman Islands Child Month is being celebrated under the theme "Rise Up and A.F.F.I.R.M." (Acknowledge, Friend, Favor, Influence, Respect and Motivate our children). Child Month activities will be facilitated at preschool centers, elementary schools, high schools and businesses throughout the islands. Children will be encouraged and celebrated and as a society, we will seek to do what is in the best interest of the child, spiritually, socially, emotionally and physically. The Human Rights Commission of the Cayman Islands will also seek to remind persons that children do have rights and we should safeguard the rights of the child.

There is at this time an elevated consciousness regarding family values as persons gather around in family groups to celebrate with each other, to remember milestones, to share fellowship and meals and to identify with the general sentiments what it means to be family.

These months can however evoke deep emotions as some persons have never had the experience of being parents, some have lost parents or children and for some it is the memory of a beautiful June wedding and the pain of loss that might be associated with a divorce. Sometimes, in the midst of the family gathering there is schism, disagreements and decisions around distancing from each other. For some the family has become obsolete and there is a preference for strangers or to be alone.

This focus is not only on the normal expression for ministry to those who are blessed with the happiness of family but also there must be prayerful and practical expression offered to those whose needs and circumstances might be different.
