We share the following statistics, although based on the United States of America; the data can inform us of some of the realities for us in the Cayman Islands:

Men's Statistics Gathered by Man in the Mirror:

- 113,000,000 men in America are 15 years of age and older
- 69,000,000 of these men make no profession of faith in Christ
- Only 6,000,000 men are involved in discipleship or spiritual formation—1 in 18 men. Imagine putting a football team on the field, and only one player had studied the playbook.
- We have become a fatherless nation. 33%5 of the 72 million children in America will go to bed tonight without their biological father in the home.
- 73% of households with children under 18 headed by married couples (vs. 91% in 1960); 27% households headed by single parents
- Nuclear families comprise less than 23.5% of households
- ullet 40% of troubled boys raised are by divorced or separated parents
- More than 50% children born in 1990s spend part childhood in single parent home
- Two years after a divorce only 53% of children see their non-custodial parent on a monthly basis. Ten years after the divorce on 28% have monthly contact
- 66% children born in America will not live with both biological parents through the age of
