# **"ROLL-OUT" OF CHILD PROTECTION POLICY**

nder the theme "Safe people, Safe spaces, Safe practices", 27 ordained ministers, lay pastors and lay leaders selected from the three Regions in Jamaica, met on Saturday, June 10 for the first phase of the Implementation plan for the UCJCI Child Care and Protection Policy.

#### These 27 frontrunners were

trained as trainers to prepare congregation's ministers, elders, church school superintendents, teachers, youth ministry advisors and coordinators, Girls' and Boys' Brigade leaders, and other adult workers in the Children's and Youth Ministries to implement the policy.

Rev. Noble Bloomfield grounded the training in bible stories involving children who experienced crisis, and prepared the participants to competently instruct and enable youth and children's ministry workers on the goals, principles and tools relevant to the policy.

The participants embraced the training with enthusiasm and passion which saw them taking ownership of the policy and committing to its successful implementation.

This commitment was further reinforced by the **affirmation of a pledge.** 

The training concluded with the presentation of certificates to each participant.

The next phase will see our eager trainers meeting with the congregational leaders.
