BUILDING CAPACITY !



s we continue our overview of the reports highlighted during our 40th Synod, the report form the Human and Missions Resource Unit provides important information on how our Church is taking a systematic approach towards building capacity and empowering its employees at all levels to carry out with efficiency, the tasks that will enable the goals of the Renewal and Transformation Programme to be realized with maximum efficiency.

Everyone, at all levels is provided the opportunity to analyze where they are now, identify areas requiring improvement and then enabled to access the training that will enable the filling in of the perceived gaps of knowledge.

Within this context, the following highlights the approach taken by the Human and Mission Resources Unit which is currently focused on the following:

•To ensure the delivery of appropriate social support and accompaniment for all employees

•To respond to the personnel development needs of the UCJCI

•To formalize and establish policies related to personnel

•To improve personnel data/ records management system

Some of the important programmes that have been addressed. Include:

1.Retirement Preparation Programme

This programme continues to be an effective tool in helping those in ministry prepare and transition from active service to the retirement phase of their life vocation.

2.Clergy's Performance Appraisal System

The Performance Appraisal System for Ordained Ministers was implemented in 2015 with varying success across the regions.

One major issue relates to the availability of the independent appraisers and this affected the timeliness of completing the appraisals in some of the regions.

Having reviewed the process, it was agreed that the

appraisal should be a biannual exercise and so the next set of appraisals will be conducted at the end of 2017.

3.Leadership Capacity Development

The Deputy General Secretaries in the Jamaican Regions completed their capacity building engagements, through training seminars and workshops in the following areas:

•Performance Management & Evaluation

•Critical Thinking for Managers and Decision Makers

•Leading with Emotional Intelligence

•Managing Emotions within the Workplace

•Understanding and Applying the labour laws

•Perfecting your Communication and Presentation Skills

The training and development initiatives include post-appraisal actions, and are all aimed at improving the effectiveness and efficiency of the Regional and Central Offices.
