

# **CHURCH PLANTING**

s the United Church pursues its on-going strategy to effect, spiritual, numerical and financial growth, General Secretary, Rev. Norbert Stephens in his Synod Report, noted that:

"It bears repeating that church growth is the result of deliberate and concerted effort of the whole community of faith."

"When we pursue the vision of a needs-meeting church, through deliberate discipleship evidenced through a commitment to prayer and discernment, faithful proclamation and embodiment of the Word, our passion to care for and advocate for one another and for those on the margins of life, we will continue to experience and sustain the growth trend of our congregations.

In addition, he has challenged all congregations to make deliberate effort at **Church Planting**.

"I wish to reiterate at this Synod ", he said, "that we should encourage the planting of at least one (1) congregation per year and have each planting recognized at the annual Synodical gathering (Convocation/Synod) as a tangible sign of our commitment to renewal and growth".

Within this context, encouragement must be extended to the **New Harbour Church Planting initiative** which has met upon a significant challenge as the Church has been unable to secure the desired access to the gift of land.

The Synod is however pleased to note the progress being made at Esher in the North Eastern Region and in Spot Valley, in the Western Region.

# Historic Day for World Churches



The World Communion of Reformed Churches (WCRC) has formally joined an ecumenical statement with Roman Catholics, Lutherans and Methodists aiming to overcome divisions between Protestants and Roman Catholics from the time of the Protestant Reformation.

"Today is a historic day," said Jerry Pillay, president of the WCRC, at a ceremony on 5 July in the eastern German town of Wittenberg, where Martin Luther lived and worked. "The documents we are signing today are significant and symbolic of the road we are to travel."
