hat about a United Church Media Centre? It was the dream of the late great Rev. Earl Thames to have such a Centre, and there is thought that perhaps the time has come, and that it should be realized and named in his memory, as the "Earl Thames Media Centre." The dream included the establishment of our own Radio Station, Television Station and Newspaper.

What are the possibilities?

Current thought is that it is all possible, and perhaps the time has come to make at least part of the dream a reality. In terms of cost and preparation time for its initiation, the 'easiest to initiate would be the **Newspaper**, and thoughts are to take steps to its initiation as soon as possible.

A quarterly Tabloid newspaper is being considered that would speak to the functions of the Church; provide a channel of communication as a public advocate speaking on behalf of the 'voiceless' and the disadvantaged on issues which are currently agitating the minds of the public such as **Crime and Violence**, 'Child Abuse', 'Domestic Violence', and 'Human Trafficking', among other social ills.

It would also be a channel for the Church and its members to meet its leaders in a special way, voice their opinions through a **Feedback page**, on issues congregants would like to be addressed, and also importantly learn more about the Word, sharing in perceptions being offered by various **columnists** drawn from our Union.

Such a newspaper would however require collective effort from each region. We will need **Regional Editorial Committees**, to be formed, who would assist in sourcing **articles** from their Region, as well as supportive **advertisements**, to help us cover publishing costs, and also to help in the **distribution** of the Newspaper. As soon as this is done and the teams are actively engaged however,

we would be ready to go...

Please let 'UPDATE' know vour thoughts, by writing or calling the General Secretary, and possibly volunteering your help. We believe that the aegis of this Newspaper is timely, given the increasing expectations if not demands of the Church to have a more public voice on issues that are affecting the majority of our people. We are called as a Church to "touch lives" in meaningful ways, and our Mission is to bear faithful witness to God's love to all persons through lifegiving worship and evangelism, social and educational engagement, personal empowerment, advocacy and faith formation toward a just and peaceful society and the ultimate experience of God's Kingdom"

We must do so in as many ways as possible and our newspaper could be one of the ways we would be able to reach in a meaningful way, persons who need to be counselled advised and nurtured towards accessing the healing that they currently do not receive.

Once our newspaper is off the ground, then we could look at the other vehicles of communication that are part of **Rev. Thames' dream. DREAM WITH US!**

r. Parris Lyew-Ayee of The University of the West Indies, will deliver this year's Churches Emancipation Lecture. The Lecture takes place on Sunday, July 30, 2017, at 4:00 pm at the Meadowbrook United Church, 2 Flemington Drive, in Kingston. The topic will be: 'Youth and Technology: Societal Impact'.



An eminent Caribbean geologist and researcher, he has undertaken extensive geography-based analyses in areas including crime and security management initiatives; road safety and traffic analyses; public health services; natural hazards and the environment; business development; business distribution modelling; and software engineering. Among his recent publications is the highly rated book "Natural Hazards Atlas of Jamaica".

These are among the issues and impacts that Dr Lyew-Ayee is expected to explore as he delivers the 24th Renewal in the Churches Emancipation Lecture. The event is organized each year by an Emancipation Lecture Committee with members drawn from a group of churches, including Bethel Baptist Church, Boulevard Baptist Church, Hope United Church, Meadowbrook United Church, and Webster Memorial United Church, as well as the United Theological College of the West Indies (UTCWI).
