Thanksgiving Service will be held on Saturday September 9, at Davyton United Church at 11 am. f all the Spiritual Disciplines of our Church, perhaps the one that challenges us most, is that of Stewardship; - in all its forms; Time, Talent and Treasure.

Stewardship, a concept best understood as the care and management of that which belongs to another presents in itself a challenge that many find difficult to accept. For what we often speak of as "ours," in reality belongs to another — God.

In the words of the Apostle Paul, **"What do you have** that you did not receive?"

Part of the difficulty it is thought has come about, because too often Stewardship has come to be associated merely with money, which many find difficult to part with; although surprisingly some congregations have found members more willing to give of their money rather than of their time and talents.

The reality is that no one can be a biblical steward who doesn't first understand



the gospel — For the gospel of Jesus Christ, transforms more than a person's relationship to God; it also transforms a person's relationship to everything else.

One cannot also escape the reality the discipline of stewardship is intentional and does not arrive in us fully formed with the indwelling of the Holy Spirit. It **must be cultivated.** For without discipline, the best plans to use our time, talent and treasure to the glory of God, may become overwhelmed by feelings of the moment, that negate the desired intent to give back.

That is why, the steps taken by the **North Eastern Region**al **Mission Council (NERMC)** to inculcate in our youth the practice of tithing through the use of tithing bags is to be applauded. The Children's Tithing or Offering bag a special project of Pastor Sadie Findlay is a thrust to encourage our children to practice the discipline of tithing.

The Project was re-launched, in 2016, placing greater emphasis on encouraging children to give to God from their own resources (lunch money, monetary gifts, etc.)

The aim is to seek to identify advocates in congregations to assist with articulating the message to the children and also to identify a specific Sunday when congregations in NERMC would relaunch the bag.

To date the project has been launched in **twenty (20) congregations** including Webster Memorial, Port Maria, Harbour View, Boulevard, Meadowbrook, St. Paul's (Marverly), Free Hill, Seaton, Mount Regale, Greendale Charge, Buff Bay Charge, Hope Bay Charge.

As we approach the month of the **Harvest** it may be an appropriate time to look at initiating **the Children's Offering Bag in your congregation !**


Prior to that, she was the Chair of the Mission, Witness and Service Committee of the CAC.
