

BUILDING THE FAMILY ALTAR



he work to provide material for worship and Christian education in households emphasizes UCJCI's conviction to seek transformation of the world through Christ.

Each week, a liturgy, or order of worship, is prepared by the House Liturgy Team. The material follows the worship themes set out by the Synod for use in congregations. The liturgy is adaptable to different home settings— living room, around the dining table, the verandah, the garden or yard. It is interactive and contains elements for different age groups. It fosters discussion and activity to facilitate deeper understanding. There are object lessons which incorporate items in the home to explain concepts.

The greatest advantage is that it facilitates teaching of the Christian faith right in the home among those who know each other well. Children are taught about the bible and the teachings of the church. Youth can be helped to understand the bible in relation to issues concerning them. Members of the household are encouraged to talk to each other, pray for and with each other and share their concerns and struggles. This practice, building the family altar, helps to make scripture relatable to life

The Fellowship will reach out to families within their membership who need help and support, One Council will host virtual parenting talk shows for parents in the church and wider communities.







According to the Church's Liturgical Calendar, on January 6, 2021, we entered the Season of Epiphany.

Epiphany is a special day as well as a season between Christmas and Lent. The word 'epiphany' means manifestation, revelation and it refers to the fact that Jesus is the Son of God, God's self-revelation to the world in human form. It also means a sudden, profound understanding or realization of something.

In Western Christianity, Epiphany commemorates the visits of the Magi (Three Kings) who followed the star of Bethlehem across the desert to meet Jesus. This indicates Jesus' physical manifestation to the Gentiles. For Eastern Christianity, Epiphany is associated with the baptism of Jesus in the Jordan River, and is seen as his manifestation to the world as the Son of God.

Like the Magi, may we, too, be open to be surprised as we continue on our journey. Like those at the river Jordan, may we have an 'eye' to see Jesus in the common and ordinary.

May we also be rooted and resilient as we respond in HOPE to the many challenges we face in our personal lives and collectively as a Church.
