IT'S 'JAMAICA NIGHT' AT SHIRLEY'S





"It will be a really special night!" promises Manager, Mrs. Shernett Smith, "and we hope to make it a monthly event, which will take place on the last Thursday or Friday of each month. 
GREENDALE UNITED HOSTS SENSITIZATION SESSION ON "THE RIGHTS OF THE CHILD".
