CONVOCATION

nder the "Disciples for Life; Disciples of Peace" the UCJCI has put forward a proposal for a 'Peace Promotion Initiative,' to promote the theme of 'Convocation 2018', over the ensuing weeks until Convocation day April 15, (Jamaica) and April 22, (Cayman) 2018.

Congregations are being asked to dedicate five (5) minutes to undertaking a symbolic exercise that communicates the message of **PEACE**, backed by spiritual and practical action. Each Congregation is to establish a circular **Peace Table** and place on it a bible, oil and a lit candle.

•On Sunday, February 18, 2018: PEACE IN OUR HOMES may be celebrated by inviting to the Peace Table, families in congregations that are challenged because of conflict, and/or violence. The congregants could stand and join hands, as the Minisfor them.

•On Sunday, February 25, 2018: PEACE IN OUR COMMU-

theme: inviting representatives of neighbouring communities to join in worship. Congregations are being encouraged to invite them to the Peace Table where, while the congregants stand, they could join hands and be led into prayer, for peace or sustained peace in their communities.

> •On Sunday, March 4, 2018: PEACE IN OUR SCHOOLS may be celebrated by asking students to wear their uniforms to church. During the service, they, along with teachers and principals could be prayed for. Youth groups within the congregations could also be asked to offer a dramatic presentation that promotes peace in schools.

•On Sunday, March 11, 2018: PEACE IN THE CONGREGATION may be marked with sermons addressing the issue of **PEACE** IN THE LOCAL CONGREGA-TIONS; establishing linkages to the proposed Synodical Subfocus for the week: "How to ter/Lay Pastor leads in prayer Use the Word in Decisionmaking". -What does the Word of God say about how our decisions impact the peace between Believers in NITIES could be marked by Christ? Members of the con-

gregation who are challenged by situations of conflict within the congregation., could be invited to the Peace Table for prayer.

•On Sunday, March 18, 2018: PEACE ACROSS DENOMINA-**TIONS** is the suggested theme. The proposal is to Invite members of five (5) denominations to our worship service. They are then to be invited to the Peace Table, along with a member of The United Church; joining hands, as the Minister/Lay Pastor prays for unity among believers across denominations. The congregation stands and joins hands in solidarity.

•On Sunday, March 25, 2018: PEACE IN OUR PARISH will be an opportunity to highlight the work of the Peace Management Initiative (PMI) and/or community groups working for peace in the community. Invite to the Peace Table members of the Jamaica Constabulary Force (JCF)/ Royal Cayman Islands Police Service (RCIPS), Judiciary, Justices of the Peace, Mediators, and Political Representatives among others. • On Sunday April 8, 2018: PEACE IN THE WORLD will be the final theme. The suggestion is to have a child read a poem of "PEACE" as the benediction. The poem such as that which follows, could be printed in the Order of Service:

'WORLD PEACE'
