Is the church dead?

The church today exists in a post-modern age or what some would characterize as a post-church age; one in which the relevance and effectiveness of the church is and has been ing to determine where to cut.

In the landscape of churches, we are considered among the "Traditional" churches, mainly because of our long history as a denomination inclusive of our antecedents. Colloquially, we are seen as traditional because of the value placed on the singing of hymns and sometimes, the use of organ music. Not to mention the fact that "praise and worship" and the playing of the trap-set are fairly new phenomena. But even more so, we are seen as traditional because we do not necessarily run up and down and perform acrobatic feats in the aisle of the church.

The question that one is led to ask is "Is the church dead?" We are seen by many as a church without power and a church without a God. In essence, we are seen as dead. This question is one that confronts us as we examine the current reality of our church. We see the numbers in church or online on a Sunday morning or bible studies and even prayer meetings and oftentimes wonder what is the point. Ministers spend time in the word to unearth its truth to share with the flock but end up, many times, sharing it with the benches. They go to crusades and street meetings and few from the church show up. We struggle financially, many living from hand to mouth and paycheck to paycheck and like the mockers of the writer of Psalm 42, they ask us "where is your God?" We are seen like that of Ezekiel's vision in chapter 10 where the presence of God left Israel. Is the church dead?

The answer to the question is simple. It is an emphatic **NO!** How can the church be dead when God has said, "And I say also unto thee, That thou art Peter, and upon this rock I will build my church; and the gates of hell shall not prevail against it." – Matthew 16: 18; recognizing that even as the changing time may challenge our relevance and effectiveness, the gates of hell shall not prevail. Hasn't God said in His word that, "But ve shall receive power, after that the Holy Ghost is come upon you: and ye shall be witnesses unto me both in Jerusalem, and in all Judaea, and in Samaria, and unto the uttermost part of the called into question and even greater scrutiny. For to one is given by the Spirit the word of wisdom; to another the word of knowledge by the same Spirit; To another faith by the same Spirit; to another the gifts of healing by the same Spirit; To another the working of miracles; to another prophecy; to another discerning of spirits; to another divers kinds of tongues; to another the interpretation of tongues: But all these worketh that one and the selfsame Spirit, dividing to every man severally as he will." – I^{st} Corinthians 12:1-11

> What many do not see are the times when we pray and healing and deliverance comes. They do not see those prayer meetings when the presence and power of God are on full display. They do not see when someone comes in possessed and leaves with the Spirit of God in their life. They do not see when we go into homes and by the power of God bring peace to its occupants. Many do not see when the people pray and communities at war become communities of peace. They do not see when persons come seeking silver and gold and leave not just with silver and gold but also with the Spirit of God having had a salvation experience. Many have not heard tongues being spoken and the

interpretation follows and confirmed by our believers. Some have not seen the discernment and wisdom being exercised. To suggest that we are dead is to say that God no longer has the power to change situations. To say that we are dead is to spit in God's face even after He has invested His Spirit in us. This is not to say that God is at our beck and call, but God works through us to further His will because He chooses to do so. We are not dead and cannot be dead. For us to be dead, God would not be God. God is not like man that He should lie and He honours His word even above His name so the church cannot be overcome.

Instead of determining where to cut to do the autopsy, let us recognize and find the pulse, tap into the Holy Spirit through repentance with humility, living lives that are pleasing to God and worthy of the calling to which we have been called.


All his years at Torrington he has been a faithful member of the Men's Fellowship. He cherishes his independence and even goes out to do his personal business such as paying his utility bills.






President General of the Women's Fellowship, 2022


