

UCJCI 43rd SYNOD THEME - Rooted, Resilient: Re-ignited by the Spirit (Return, Reconnect, Realign, Re-ignite)

Everything New!

Please read Isaiah 43:15-16 and 19-21

When I was a little girl growing up on Elizabeth Street in West Bay, I would be so delighted if, when I was getting ready for school, my mother would say, "see, I've made you a new pair of garters". My mother was an excellent seamstress and when the tops of my socks would get all stretched up, and Daddy hadn't returned home from his turtling voyages to Key West, Florida when he would bring new clothes, socks, shoes, small bicycles, and some of everything for us, Mommy would make me a pair of garters so that my socks could stay up on my spindly little legs. Garters were simply a length of elastic with its two ends sewn together, and then you'd slip them over the socks and then turn down the tops of your socks so that no one could see how really stretched up they were! New garters were a hot item and you felt like a princess when you wore them to school. It was the same when you got a new school uniform at the start of the term, or a new dress, frilly socks and patent leather shoes to wear to the Christmas programme! All things new ...

In these Bible verses from Isaiah 43, "the LORD, the Holy One" is saying, "Forget the former things ... do not dwell on the past" - in other words, don't park yourself there ... See, I am doing a new thing! now it springs up; do you not recognize it? Don't you understand? I am making a way in the wilderness (a place that no one wants to get lost) ... and streams in the wasteland a hot and harsh desert !"



There is so much zing and excitement in these lines, you almost wish you had wings to fly and celebrate ... but, before God says this, God reminds us of a few things God is going to do or has already done:

- Do not fear, for I have redeemed you; I have summoned you by name; you are mine.
- When you pass through the waters, I will be with you;
- and when you pass through the rivers, they will not sweep over you.
- When you walk through the fire, you will not be burned; the flames will not set you ablaze.
- he who made a way through the sea, a path through the mighty waters,
- who drew out the chariots and horses, the army and reinforcements together, and they lay there, never to rise again, extinguished, snuffed out like a wick:
- I am the LORD your God, the Holy One of Israel, your Savior; Since you are precious and honored in my sight, and because I love you!

This is a brand-new year, only 19 days old, and yet, already we're moaning and groaning, we're complaining, we're just dragging along ... and less than 30 days ago we again celebrated the birth of our Lord Jesus Christ, and already we've forgotten that ... we've stopped playing the beautiful Christmas music ... the Christmas trees have all gone to the shredder or have been packed away in some box or other ... the twinkling lights have all been taken down - how irrelevant it all seems, just after a few days – are we just doing Christmas for the sake of it or because it's a date on our calendar?

Is it all about the hurriedness and craziness of the days before Christmas ... yet God continues to remind us, "Behold, I am doing a new thing! Don't you see it? Don't you comprehend it? Don't you feel it in your heart, in your soul? Don't you smell it?"

God continues to pour out love on us through His Son Jesus Christ - "Come to Me ... come and sit for a while ... let's talk" ... God continues to pick us up, clean us up, and dress us up in our finest, see? God makes all things new.

The beautiful hymn says, "New every morning is the love our waking and uprising prove; through sleep and darkness safely brought, restored to life ... and power ... and thought. New mercies each returning day hover around us, while we pray. New perils passed, new sins forgiven, new thoughts of God, new hopes of heaven" - everything new!

As God allows each of us to continue through this year, I pray that you will be renewed and reanointed as you have a new and fresh encounter with our Lord Jesus Christ – He will make you brand new so that you can be His witness in your Church, your community and wherever you go. God is making all things

new; God is reigniting us to witness to His redeeming love and forgiveness.

Pastor Rick Warren says, "(New Year's) Resolutions and rules aren't enough to change the human heart. Heart transformation requires the love of God inside you. The beginning of healthy change starts inside you. When you invite Jesus to be the Savior and Lord (manager) of your life, your past is forgiven, you get a new purpose for living, you get a home in heaven, and you plug into God's power to change your life."

It is time for us to return to God for revival – allowing God to make all things new in our lives, in our Churches and in our families – forget about the past, put that into a box and put that box on the top shelf, in the corner! This is a new day ... this is a new year ... this is a new time – come, now is the time to return to God who loves us and gave Himself for us ... it is time for us to return to the Cross of Christ for it was there by faith we received our sight –behold, He is making all things new!

Eternal and most gracious Father, we bow before Your throne of grace and offer to You our lives, all messed up as they might be, but we remember what you've said, "forget the former things, see I am doing something new!" So, help us that, as we rise, we will catch that vision and feel the newness in ourselves that can only come from You so that we will be empowered to go forth in Your name, and covered by Your Spirit, to share Your Gospel! IS / IVCF CAYMAN ISLANDS INTER-SCHOOL / INTER-VARSITY CHRISTIAN FELLOWSHIP


