Even more encouraging was that for the 2017 Convention numbers increased requiring a change of venue. It can be said with justification our youth are UP, UP, UP!!!

She has begun to learn about the Maori culture and to understand the dynamics of the New Zealand lifestyle. She has participated in The Amazing Race around the city of Auckland. They were paired up into teams, each team was given a map and a sheet of different places they needed to visit as well as clues and questions about different tourist attractions in Auckland. Renita and Tetoaiti formed the team that emerged victorious and won the
